The Peewaalia lunar year is approximately 354 days long and regularly has 12 moons (months). However, approximately every 3 years waawiita kiilhswa 'Lost Moon' is added to the end of the lunar year, resulting in 13 moons. Pahsaahkaahkanka neepinwaki 'summer solstice' nearing the end of acikatakiilhswa 'Hilling The Corn Moon' results in the appearance of waawiita kiilhswa. This ensures the lunar calendar stays connected with ecological occurrences. Waawiita kiilhswa will occur this winter, at the end of the 2025 Peewaalia lunar year.

A lunar month lasts approximately 29.5 days; therefore, months are alternated from 29 to 30 days to compensate for the half day.

The Peewaalia lunar year begins with cecaahkwa kiilhswa 'Sandhill Crane Moon'. Peoria Moons (Peoria Months) are named to recognize specific ecological occurrences during the time of year they regularly occur. Naming and timekeeping of the lunar year provides direction for daily life and events such as: planting, crop harvesting, hunting, maintenance and repairs, seasonal preparation, ecological changes, summer solstice, green corn harvest and much more.

The Peewaalia lunar calendar reflects days in the top left corner; Gregorian dates are located in the lower left corner. Moon 'kiilhswa' is our Grandfather and is described as 'he' throughout the Peewaalia lunar calendar.

The Peoria lunar month follows the lunar phases throughout the month as the moon grows and then dies away. The phases of the moon are split between two types of phases: keešaakosita kiilhswa, the moon is growing larger (the waxing phases) and peemineeta kiilhswa, the moon is going along dying (the waning phases).



peemineeta kiilhswa

the moon is going along dying,
waning phase



After peemineeta kiilhswa, when the waning phases end, the moon dies when he goes dark. Soon after (about 3 days later), the moon will sprout again when the first thin sliver of moon is visible. At that time, he will be saakiwa kiilhswa, once again starting a new lunar month.

waahseekiilhswa

keešaakosita kiilhswa the moon is growing larger waxing phase

saakiwa kiilhswa the moon has sprouted (first thin sliver visible) the new moon

waakhšinka kiilhswa crescent moon

napale kiilhswa half moon first quarter phase

naawi waawayiisita kiilhswa he is almost a full moon waxing gibbous moon


waawayiisita kiilhswa full moon

peemineeta kiilhswa the moon is going along dying waning phase

kiinte waawayiisita kiilhswa he was just a full moon waning gibbous moon

napale neepiki kiilhswa the moon is half dead last quarter phase

myaalsiwa kiilhswa the moon is very ill (only a sliver left) waning crescent phase



Preaspiration (preaspirated “h”) is like a sound of a small puff of air or breath of air (like an “h” sound) before the consonant written.



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
